

Request For Applications PCLA Elective Co-sponsorship

The **Primary Care Leadership Academy (PCLA)** is pleased to request applications for co-sponsorship of student electives hosted by the School of Medicine beginning Fall 2014.

Who: PCLA is an organization created and administered by the Department of Family and Community Medicine with the primary goals of engaging students, residents and faculty in practicing primary care, engaging in primary care innovation efforts, promoting primary care careers, developing mentorship, increasing the status of primary care, and advocating locally and nationally for efforts to improve primary care and preventive health efforts. *“Inspiring and inspired people...”*

What: PCLA is willing to provide up to **\$100** per session of supplemental funding to co-sponsor elective sessions that address **at least one** of the following primary care themes. Funds may be applied to technology, food, or speaker costs of hosting a particular elective session. Electives may request funding for multiple sessions.

Primary Care Themes:

- Preventative Health
- Health Systems and Policy
- Community Engagement and Health Promotion
- Caring for the Underserved
- Quality Improvement
- Longitudinal Outpatient Medicine
- Transformations in Primary Care
- Other (please explain)

How to Apply:

1. Identify a PCLA member in your elective or apply to become a PCLA member yourself. (Brief application attached)
2. Submit a paragraph proposal detailing the:
 - a. Title and date of your session
 - b. A brief description of your session (include speaker names if applicable) and explanation of how the session will address one of the above themes
 - c. The amount of funds requested (not to exceed \$100 per session) and how they will be used
 - d. Name and contact information of the PCLA member in your elective to whom the funds will be disbursed

Post-Session Requirements:

Within 2 weeks of hosting your session, please send a final report that includes the number of session attendants and a brief reflection (<200 words) on how this session improved participant understanding of primary care.

Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis. Our review committee will respond within 2 weeks and you will receive further instructions on how to access your elective co-sponsorship funds.
